NOTICE OF RACE Women's Regatta A Part of Nantucket Race Week August 16, 2023

#### 1. <u>RULES</u>

The Regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined by *The Racing Rules of Sailing,* including Appendix V1 (Alternative Penalties).

#### 2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available on the Official Notice Board three days prior to the regatta.

#### 3. <u>COMMUNICATIONS</u>

- 3.1. The Official Notice Board is online at <u>www.nantucketraceweek.org</u>.
- 3.2. On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.

#### 4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1. There will be three Divisions: Rhodes-19 Open, Rhodes-19 Coached, and Herreshoff 12 ½.
- 4.2. All women, and only women, are eligible.
- 4.3. Entries will be accepted until the deadline or until all available boats are fully subscribed, whichever comes first.
- 4.4. Rhodes-19 teams and Herreshoff 12 ½ teams may enter by completing the entry form online (click on the Sailing tab) and then submitting the entry form, together with the required fee, no later than Monday, August 14 at 1800.
- 4.5. Rhodes-19s will be a single starting Class, whether using a spinnaker or not. Prizes will be awarded in Open and Coached Divisions.
- 4.6. The Organizing Authority, may, at its sole discretion, accept any late entry.
- 4.7. Membership in US Sailing is encouraged.

#### 5. <u>FEES</u>

The entry fee is \$50 per team.

#### 6. ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the OA.

#### 7. <u>SCHEDULE</u>

- 7.1. The competitors meeting will be at 1030 on the NYC patio.
- 7.2. The first warning signal will be at 1230.
- 7.3. Multiple races are planned.
- 7.4. Awards are scheduled at 1600 at NYC.

#### 8. <u>VENUE</u>

The available racing areas in Nantucket Harbor will be shown in the sailing instructions.

#### 9. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 9.1. When flag-Y is displayed prior to the warning signal from the race committee vessel, the Turns penalties of RRS V1 are replaced by the Scoring Penalty of RRS 44.3 for all classes, and no spinnakers shall be used.
- 9.2. The protest committee may impose penalties less than disqualification (DP), for violation of the class rules and racing rules other than those of RRS Part 1 and Part 2. This changes RRS 64.2.

#### 10. SCORING

- 10.1. One completed race constitutes a regatta.
- 10.2. When five or more races are completed, one worst score will be excluded, as permitted in RRS 90.3(b), from that boat's series score.
- 10.3. Results will be posted on the NRW Website following the regatta.

#### 11. <u>PRIZES</u>

- 11.1. First, second, and third place prizes may be awarded in each Division.
- 11.2. The top-performing skipper in a one-design fleet during the entire week will also receive a special NRW prize.
- 11.3. The Diana Brown Trophy will be awarded to the first-place boat in the Open Rhodes-19 Division.

#### 12. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with adequate and valid third-party liability insurance.

#### 13. CLEAN REGATTA

Nantucket Race Week is committed to maintaining Nantucket's clean waters and shores, and is certified by Sailors for the Sea as a gold-level Clean Regatta. All NRW participants are encouraged to follow the goals and requirements of the Clean Regatta Program.

#### 14. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 14.1. Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See *RRS* 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers, Nantucket Race Week L.L.C., the Nantucket Yacht Club, Great Harbor Yacht Club, Nantucket Community Sailing, Race Committee, Protest Committee, Technical Committee, volunteers, sponsors, agents, employees, or any other organization or official providing services at the request of any of the foregoing in connection with the events will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property, or the injury, disease or illness to any person sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor (owners, skippers, crews and support persons) agrees to release the race organizers and all persons and groups listed above from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 14.2. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
