





Trash Skimmers


Thanks to a grant from the ReMain Nantucket Fund of the Community Foundation for Nantucket, Nantucket Community Sailing is collaborating with Mass Audubon and the Maria Mitchell Association to pilot two Seabin Trash Skimmers in Nantucket Harbor this summer. The Seabins float in the water with a pump and container which collects debris, including microplastics and fuel. Interns from Mass Audubon and Maria Mitchell will sort the collected trash to analyze what is in Nantucket's waters. Come down to the Nantucket Boat Basin and see the trash skimmers in action!









The year started strong

- New Race Week Village planned at Children's Beach
- Strong summer sailing programs registration
 - 48% year-round children
 - Most receiving scholarships
- Plans for enhanced community outreach, more Tiny Salts, new Silver Sailors
- New fundraising initiatives:
 - "Rebuild the Fleet" campaign for Opti's and 420s
 - Florida Friend-raiser Events: Palm Beach,
 - Vero Beach, Naples
 - SeaBin trash skimmer project with Maria Mitchell and Mass Audubon

2020 Results

Programs

- Short season with small staff, fewer boats in the water, Opti's only, safety protocols
 - 128 enrollments over 5 weeks of classes
 - 41% year round Nantucket children
- No community outreach programs
- Successful new long-term rentals
- Happy parents and sailors And wonderful hard-working staff!

Fundraising

- Stood back from fundraising until NRW
- We didn't know if we could host NRW until early July and NCS was the only island non-profit to host a fundraising event that wasn't virtual
 - Inaugural Radio-Controlled Model Boat Regatta
 - Planned for single-handed events and added
 - OHC in late July; no gatherings
- NCS supported the community
 - Distributed 150+ masks made from NRW flags

Nantucket Community Sailing's mission is to engage people of all ages in the joy of sailing, offering access to all Nantucket's youth, and teaching every participant in our programs enduring life and leadership skills, with a deep respect for the marine environment.

2021 IOD Celebrity Invitational



The Celebrity Invitational begins with an opening reception buffet dinner at the Great Harbor Yacht Club on August 18 with two days of racing and more social events on August 19 and 20, 2021. Over the two days of racing in Nantucket Sound, seven races are scheduled. Each participating team will have a celebrity tactician on-board. Races will be sailed in a fleet format and prizes will be awarded for daily and overall results. Opportunities abound for non-sailing spouses and significant others to explore and enjoy the island: beaches, bicycling, water sports, shopping, museums, sightseeing and more.

The International One Design was the first class to achieve 'International Classic Yacht' status with the International Sailing Federation. Inspired by the majestic 6-Metre class, Cornelius Shields commissioned Norwegian naval architect Bjorn Aas to design a strict one-design class. In 1935, the International One Design was born. 21-feet on the waterline, with long, graceful overhangs extending to 33-feet overall, and a powerful 45-foot rig, the IOD resembles a scaled down version of a majestic J-Boat. With fleets in Northeast Harbor, Marblehead, Nantucket, Long Island Sound, San Francisco, Nova Scotia, Bermuda, Scotland, Sweden and Norway, the IOD class has a strong tradition of inter-fleet competition. The King Edward VII Gold Cup leg of the Swedish Match tour is sailed in the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club's fleet of IODs.

Formed in 1998, the Nantucket IOD Fleet is based on a unique concept. Rather than the traditional system of sailors owning their boats individually, the fleet is owned by an association consisting of fifteen syndicates, each of which owns an undivided interest, or share equivalent to one fifteenth of the entire fleet. The boats are identical in every way: hulls, standing and running rigging, sails, supplied equipment, instruments (just a compass!), tuning, and even the bottom paint. Syndicates rotate boats on a weekly basis. It is truly one-design racing at its purest.

Celebrity Tacticians generously donate their time and talent to support Nantucket Community Sailing. A blind auction prior to the event gives amateur teams a chance to help determine tactician assignments. Bids are not required, but are nonetheless welcomed, encouraged, and importantly, deductible as charitable contributions to NCS. Pairings are announced at the Wednesday evening reception. The bidding process is strictly confidential. If a crew chooses not to bid; the organizers will make a tactician assignment.



Dawn Riley Master of Ceremonies, 3rd Year

We are thrilled that Dawn returns again to the Invitational as our Master of Ceremonies.

As CEO and Captain of America True, Dawn was the first woman to manage an America's Cup sailing team. She raced on four America's Cup and two Whitbread teams. A documentary of her first Whitbread Race onboard *Maiden* is currently in theaters. She is a former president of the Woman's Sports Foundation, served on the board of US Sailing, and is an adviser to several public service organizations.

Dawn has been in Oyster Bay, New York at Oakcliff Sailing since the inception in 2010. There she is building American leaders through sailing. A non-profit open to all, Oakcliff's signature Acorn and Sapling programs train athletes in inshore, offshore and highperformance sailing. Graduates receive training in all aspects of running a racing campaign from technical to finance to marketing and strategy. As a US Sailing training center, Oakcliff is preparing the next Olympic champions. It is also creating leaders inside and outside of the marine industry, including graduates Mark Towill and Charlie Enright, who are leading their third Ocean Race Team and placed other graduates Robyn Lesh and Sean O'Halloran with the NYYC's America's Cup team American Magic.

Recently Dawn was inducted to the National Sailing Hall of Fame.





Ken Legler | 3rd Year as Principal Race Officer

Ken began running races professionally in 1974 under the tutelage of Bill Bentsen at the US Sailing Center at Association Island, NY on Lake Ontario. There, Ken was PRO for the 470 Worlds, Laser Nationals, and US Olympic Trials for 470s and Finns. Ever since, Ken has enjoyed running countless races including Key West Race Week (23 times), Chester Race Week, Orange Bowl, and class championships for Atlantics, A Scows, Jet 14s, Int. Canoes, 420s, Optimists, Wianno Seniors, J-105s, Youth champs and Junior champs. Most of Ken's career has been spent coaching at Navy, Kings Point, the US Sailing Team, and for the past 41 years, Tufts University. Ken currently races a Rhodes-19 in Boston at the Courageous Sailing Center's summer series and winter frostbiting.

Betsy Alison | 1st Year

Currently from Newport, RI, Betsy Alison is the Director of Adult Education Programs for US Sailing. Her primary focuses are the development and promotion of education programs like Safety at Sea, Keelboat, Powerboat and Adaptive sailing to grow participation of sailors and other boaters in the USA. Prior to her current position, Betsy served as the Head Paralympic Sailing Coach for the USA from 2000 through 2016 where US sailors earned 7 Paralympic medals.

Betsy was the first female sailor inducted into the National Sailing Hall of Fame in the 2011 inaugural class. She is a 5-time Rolex Yachtswoman of the Year – the only person, male or female, to have been honored that number of times.

Betsy has won World Championship and National titles in many sailing disciplines and classes including the Shields (2x National Champion), Women's Match Racing, Yngling and lightning classes, Adams Cup, Rolex International Women's Keelboat Championship

to name a few. In November of 2005, she was honored by the Pierre de Coubertin International Fair Play Committee with a diploma in the career category for her ongoing contributions to the sport of sailing and its participants. Betsy currently serves as the Chair of the Para World Sailing Committee at World Sailing and sits on the World Sailing Council.

She received her BA at Jackson College of Tufts University in Medford, Massachusetts. Betsy has been a part of the National Training Faculty for US Sailing since 1990 and is a Master Trainer for the development of coaches and instructors for that organization. She co-authored the current Level 2 and Level 3 training manuals for coaches in training for US Sailing as well as the Adaptive Sailing manual, and routinely contributes to other publications.

Betsy works closely with Dr. Anne Allen of SailSportMed on many projects involving athletes with disabilities including safety studies, classification systems and accessibility issues. Along with Dr. Allen she co-authored a comprehensive sports medicine paper on "Sport Safety in Sailing" which was based on direct results of study done at the 2004 Paralympic Games in Athens. It was presented to the International Paralympic Committee in March of 2005 and was utilized by organizers of both the 2008 and 2012 Paralympic Games in the development of their sailing facilities.



Mike Buckley | 1st Year

Mike Buckley is a professional tactician that has spent a majority of his career competing in the Melges 20, 24, 32, 37, Farr 40, Mumm 30, Etchells, M32, and World Match Race Tour. Mike first made a name for himself becoming the first All-American in Washington College school history, a record that stands to this day. Mike has won various National, North American, and World Championships and was the 2018 United States nominee for Rolex World Sailor of the Year. A winner of the Congressional Cup, Gold Cup, and the reigning Match Racing World Champion as tactician onboard Stars+Stripes which Buckley co-founded with fellow professional American sailor, Taylor Canfield.

John Burnham | 3rd Year

John Burnham is a leadership coach and independent writer and editor living in Middletown, R.I. His career in marine publishing includes nearly 30 years as editor of *Sailing World* and *Cruising World*, plus eight years with *boats.com*, *Yachtworld.com* and *Boat Trader*. An avid racer who learned to sail at Fishers Island, N.Y., John's sailing was a three-season and eventually four-season activity, sailing everything from Sunfish and Lasers, to 420s, FJs, Bullseyes, and Windsurfers. He began crewing on offshore boats to Bermuda and up and down the East Coast including several years at the SORC, before landing back at Fishers Island in 1988 with his wife Rachel and the first of three daughters. Since then, John has focused on IOD sailing at Fishers and Shields sailing in Newport, winning three Shields and three IOD class titles. He sailed as a celebrity tactician in the very first Nantucket IOD Celebrity Invitational and then again in 2019 when he joined the winning team led by Ted Moore and Chris Gould. John and his *Norwegian Wood* crew have won the IOD World Championship three times.

Taylor Canfield | 1st Year

A former 2-time Match Racing World Champion in 2013 and 2020, number one World Sailing ranked match racer for three of the past five years, four-time winner of the Crimson Blazer at the Congressional Cup, three-time winner of the Argo Group Gold Cup and winner of countless World Match Racing Tour events in both monohull and multihulls, Taylor Canfield is a formidable name in the world of modern match racing. Taylor first made his name in Optimist dinghy sailing out of his home, St. Thomas Yacht Club in the U.S. Virgin Islands. Following an all-American collegiate sailing career, Taylor stormed on the World Match Racing Tour in 2012 with his US One team and quickly advanced to win the Tour and become Match Racing World Champion in 2013. In anticipation of WMRT moving to include multihulls on the Tour in 2016, Taylor's US One team ran a campaign in the 2015 M32 Scandinavian Series winning the series by a comfortable margin. The team narrowly missed out on the 2016 Match Racing World Championship finishing in 2nd place. Taylor finished 3rd on the WMRT leaderboard in 2017 before embarking on possibly his biggest sailing challenge. After winning

the 2018 Congressional Cup, in December 2018 the Long Beach Yacht Club announced its entry, Stars+Stripes USA, was formally accepted by the Defender and Royal New Zealand Yacht Squadron as the fifth Challenger of the 36th America's Cup. Canfield co-founded the team with fellow professional American sailor, Mike Buckley. While building the America's Cup team for a 2021 challenge in Auckland 2021, Taylor also joined the USA team competing in the SailGP circuit launched in 2019. Stars+Stripes plans to campaign for many America's Cup events to come.



Rod Favela | 1st Year

Rod Favela grew up sailing in the coastal town of Puerto La Cruz, Venezuela, where Sunfish were the "big thing" in dinghy one design racing. Simultaneously, he also developed his love for offshore racing in the Caribbean. Coaching was a mandatory part of the sailing education he went through and he helped hundred of sailors of different ages get and improve their sailing careers.

In 2005, Rod moved to the US where he kept racing dinghies and keelboat on both One Design and handicap scene but he never left out the coaching and support of other sailors. He also started his own sailing outfit business providing specialized support and equipment for racers and cruisers; always looking forward to make sailors take advantage of the best of the sailing program.

Rod is a coach for North U and keeps racing in several classes. During his time in the American sailing scene, Rod has been part of the winning teams on North American Championships on VXOne, Hobie 33 and US Sailing Championship of Champions as well as

very successful path on the offshore such as victories on the Chicago – Mac, NYYC regattas and other top finishes including the Herreshoff trophy. He is also part of the team representing Venezuela at the Gold Cup in the Star Sailors League (SSL) on RC44 (SSL 47).

Ultimately Rod remains active in the racing scene will sharing his time with his sailing business and coaching, giving back to the sport.



Tom Lihan | 8th Year

Tom Lihan grew up in Fort Lauderdale and started sailing with a local club in Lasers. He attended the United States Merchant Marine Academy (Kings Point) where he was part of the teams that won the Co-Ed dinghy Nationals, Team Racing Nationals while winning the singlehandeds his senior year. With success post-graduation in the Laser and Finn classes (wins in the Laser North Americans, Nationals, O'Day champs, Championship of Champions, Finn NAs, Finn Midwinters) he competed in the 1984 US Olympic Trials in the Finn. While starting a career and family he continued to sail various dinghies and "big boat" programs winning the 1995 US Pan Am Trials in the Laser. Tom's home yacht club is Lauderdale YC, where he is active in their well-known youth program and race management duties.

He has victories in numerous boats and has been part of the teams aboard "Spookie", "Stark Raving Mad", "Victory '83", "Hanuman", "Twizzle", "Better Place", "Decision", "Dark Shadow", "Samba Pa Ti" and recently won back-to-back Rolex Swan World Maxi class wins aboard "Freya." He has an active Etchells program, and has been known to spend too much time chasing Marlin and other gamefish aboard his Rybovich sportfish in the Bahamas.

Tom has two daughters; Sarah, (Yale '10) who won the US trials in the 470 for the 2012 London Olympics and Marissa, (US Naval Academy '14) was an All-American sailor at Annapolis.

Tom has sailed in seven IOD Celebrity Invitationals, twice aboard Jeff Ecklund's "Team Star" finishing 2nd and 4th and in 2016 he sailed with Heather Gregg finishing 3rd. In 2017 he was fortunate to sail with Sandy Adzick, co-chair of this fun and competitive Invitational.

Mike Marshall | 3rd Year

Mike Marshall grew up in Rhode Island racing Optimists, 420s, and Lasers. He graduated with a degree in Geophysics from Connecticut College, where he was co-captain of the sailing team for two years. He is now a sail designer for North Sails, focusing on sails for one-design boats and one-design custom projects. These projects include designing sails for the US Olympic 470 teams and working with many other world-championship-level programs. A recent project has been designing the sail inventory for the New York Yacht Club IC37.

In his own sailing, Mike won the J/22 Worlds in 2016, leading to a nomination for Rolex Yachtsman of the Year. He has also won the J/22 North Americans and been top-ten in multiple J/24 Worlds, North Americans, and Nationals. In addition, he serves on the board of directors for the Conanicut Island Sailing Foundation, a non-profit specializing in helping youth sailors in the Rhode Island area achieve their goals in the sport.



Mark Reynolds | 8th Year

Well-known as the "Star of the Star class," Mark is the four-time consecutive Olympic representative in the class – and two world championship titles ('00, '95) and three Olympic medals (1992 Gold, 1988 Silver, 2000 Gold) amply back up the statement. He is also the sail maker of the Star Class and has made sails for 13 of the last 15 Olympic champions.

Mark's other accomplishments start with 2nd place finishes in the 1974 and 1975 in the North American Dinghy Championships. He was Bacardi Cup Champion 7 times, tactician for the winner 2002 Farr 40 World's ISAF World Sailor of the Year and Rolex US Yachtsman of the year. In 2012, Mark was inducted into the National Sailing Hall of Fame.



Chris Snow | 4th Year

Chris Snow has spent his entire career figuring out how to make One Design sailboats go faster and win races. Currently Chris helps clients sail faster through his coaching business, The Favored End. Chris spent the majority of his career working for and running the One Design division of North Sails. He is a 10-time National or North American Champion, with many top ten World Championships to his credit. He is a former winner of the IOD Celebrity regatta as tactician in 2008 with Dan MacKeigan. Nantucket is close to home for Chris. He grew up on Cape Cod and learned to sail at Orleans Yacht Club. He is a graduate of Tabor Academy and the University of Rhode Island, sailing at both. Recently Chris has been working closely with the Warrior Sailing Program that helps introduce sailing to veterans who have been physically or mentally injured in service of our country.

The sailing gene is strong in the Snow family. Chris's wife Mary was a 4-time All American at the US Naval Academy and pursued an Olympic campaign in the late 80's in the 470 class. Their son Patrick also competed on the Navy sailing team and was an All American in 2017. Their older son Nevin just completed an Olympic campaign in the 49er class to represent the US in Tokyo in 2020 and was a 4 two-time College Sailor of the Year, competing for Georgetown University. Chris and Mary live in San Diego, CA, and are excited to be back in New England for a few days!




